Figure A21: Impact of percentage_avoided_that_conservative on case_load_total

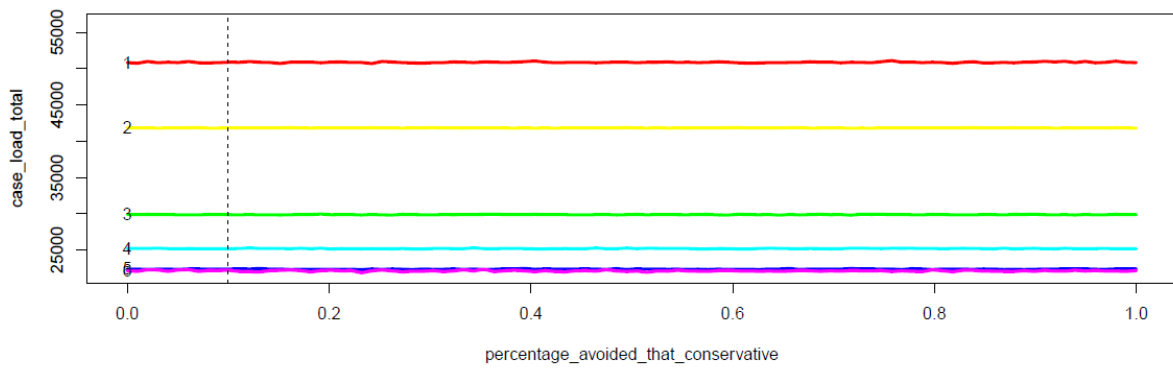
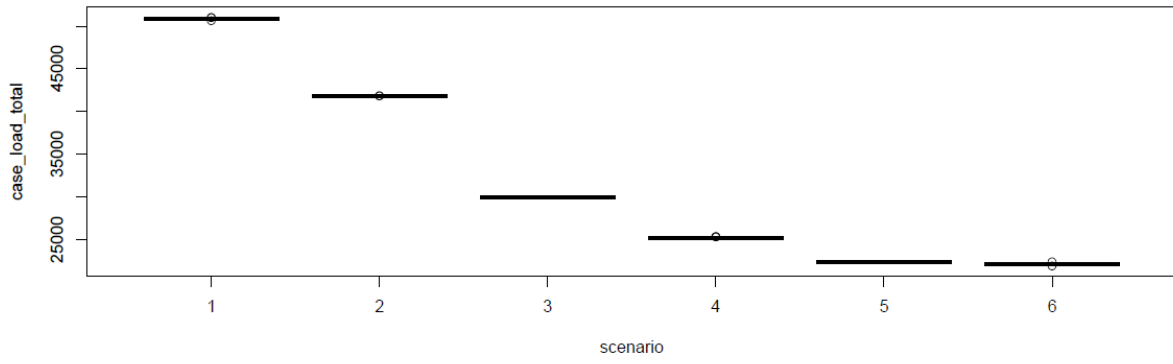


Figure A22: Impact of percentage_costs_ward on case_load_total

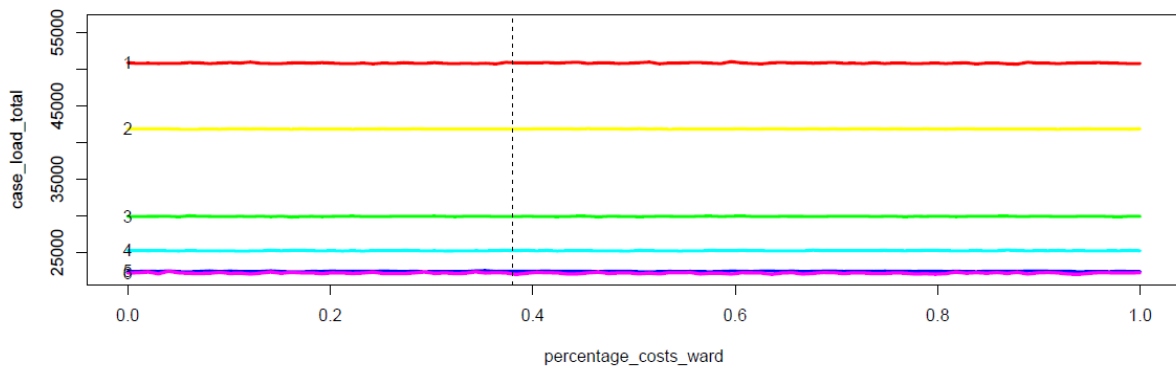
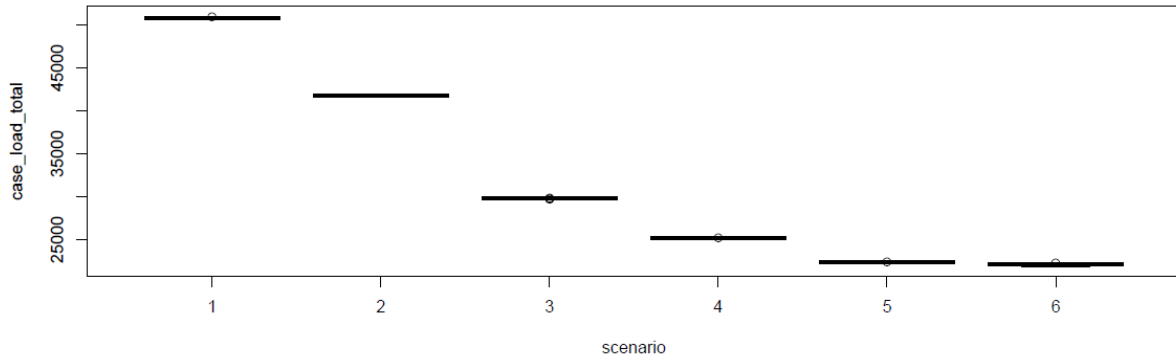


Figure A23: Impact of percentage_avoided_operated_locally on case_load_total

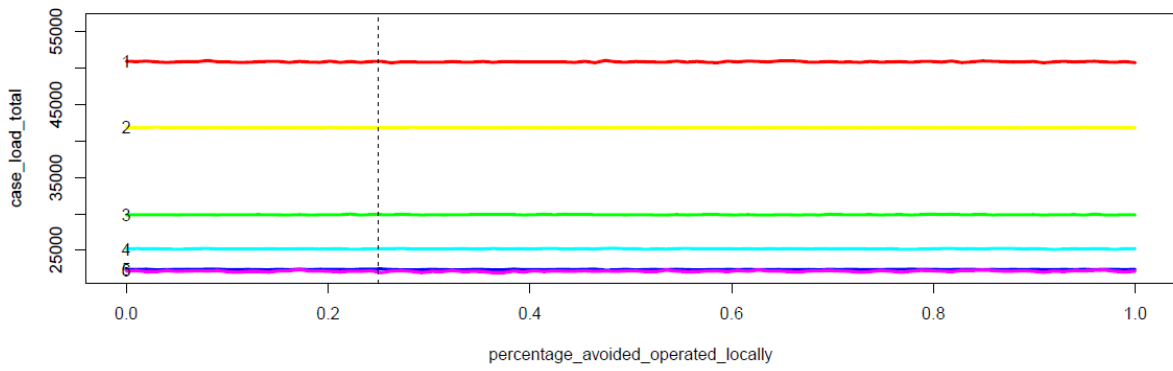
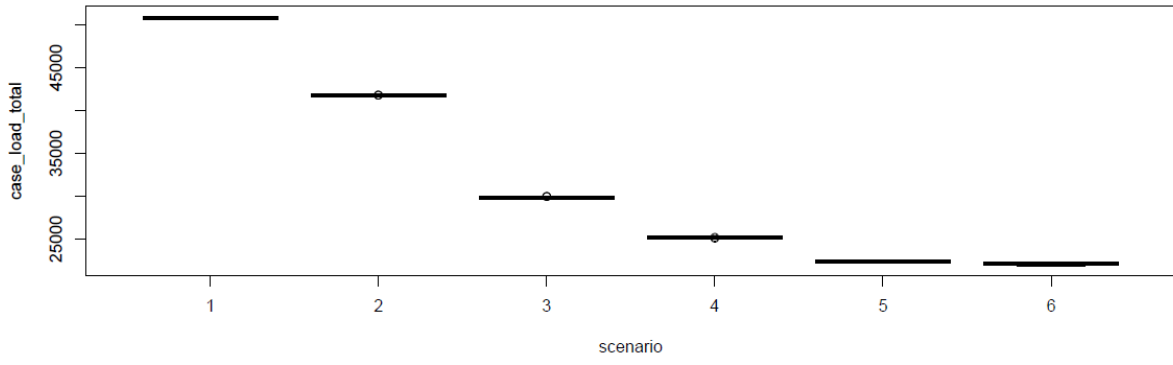


Figure A24: Impact of percentage_referrals_surgical on case_load_total

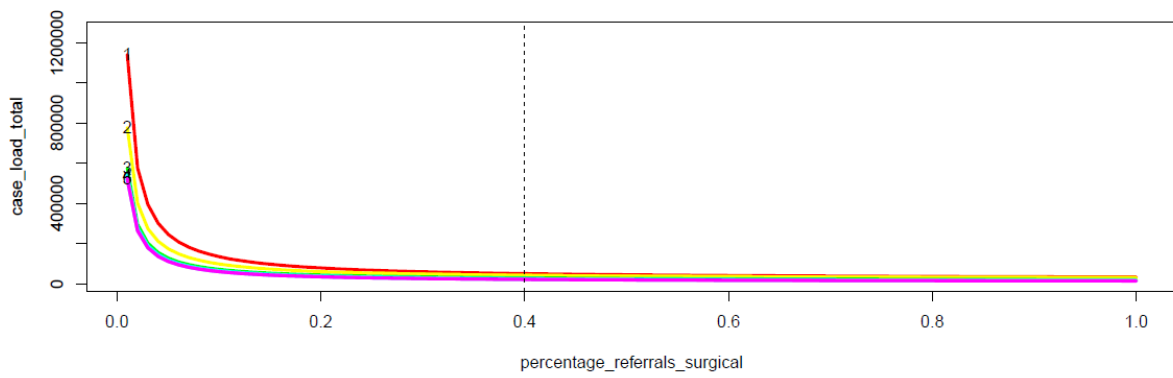
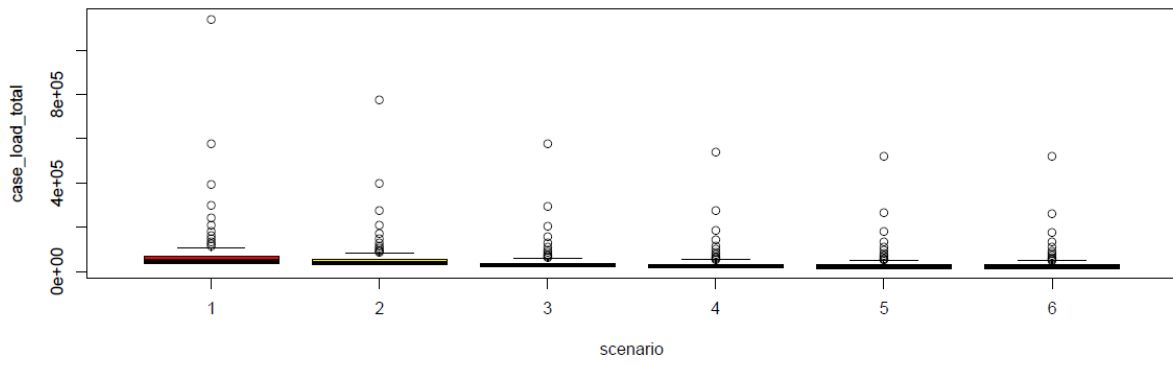


Figure A25: Impact of effectiveness_constant on case_load_total
